Why do we need relationships with kids

When we have good relationships with children we can...

- Work together as a group
- Trust and respect each other
- Engage and communicate with each other
- Have mutual trust between adults and children
- Children are more likely to do what you ask them
- Children's stress level is down and more learning can happen



Positive Effects of Building Relationships

What are the positive effects of building relationships

- Quality of teacher-child interactions improve
- Children are more kind to each other and there is more cooperation in the class
- Improvement in classroom climate
- Teachers and children feel more successful in the classroom



What strategies build Positive Relationships

Every moment that teachers and children interact with one another is an opportunity to develop a positive relationship.

- Greet children warmly
- Make eye contact, get down at their level
- Use pleasant and calm voices
- Listening to children when they talk



Next level of Building

- Keep in mind children's developmental level how does it differ for different ages?
- Learn each child's individual needs and anticipate when they might struggle
- Follow the child's lead and interest during play
- Help children understand classroom expectations
- Redirect children when they are misbehaving so they can feel successful
- Acknowledge children for their accomplishments and efforts
- How can you say YES to their requests?
- Offer children opportunity for power
- Comfort children if they want it when they are upset
